Hall of Fame Inductees

The NWRA Hall of Fame recognizes extraordinary industry professionals whose career accomplishments are noteworthy and impactful. Honorees have distinguished themselves through significant contributions to the industry and their communities. They have been leaders actively engaged in the waste industry for at least 25 years. This year, NWRA inducts five outstanding leaders into our Hall of Fame.



Patty Garbarino, Marin Sanitary Service



Michael Savage, PTR/Komar Industries



Edward R. Vogel, Vogel Disposal Service Inc.



Patty Garbarino has spent more than three decades leading innovation and sustainability in the waste and recycling industry. Starting part-time at Marin Sanitary Service in 1987, she rose to become president of the company in 2000, following in the footsteps of her father, industry pioneer Joe Garbarino (Hall of Fame Class of 2014). A passionate environmental educator and advocate, she helped launch the company's Environmental Classroom and has led major initiatives in public education, government relations and zero waste. Under her leadership, Marin Sanitary pioneered a food waste-to-energy program, established Marin County's first Household Hazardous Waste facility, and co-founded Northern Recycling, a high-capacity composting and organics facility.

Garbarino also has played a critical role in shaping California state policy, advancing legislation to reduce plastic waste, increase recycling and promote local control. Her tireless commitment to innovation, community engagement and environmental stewardship has made a lasting impact on the industry and her community.

Mike Savage celebrates 31 years in the waste and recycling industry, during which he has played a defining role in shaping its direction and growth. His leadership journey began in the mid-1990s through service on the ANSI Committees and as chairman of the Statistics Committee. He was elected to the Wastec Board of Governors in 2006, becoming vice chairman in 2008 and chairman in 2011—just as the industry was entering a historic period of transformation. Savage was instrumental in uniting the industry during the 2012 merger of the Environmental Industry Association, Wastec and NSWMA to form NWRA.

He worked tirelessly to build consensus among skeptical members, ultimately helping to craft the bylaws and structure for the new association. Savage later joined NWRA's Executive Board of Trustees and cast one of the decisive votes that brought the merger to life. His steady leadership and deep commitment were crucial in guiding the association through this period of change. He continued to serve as chairman of the Supplier Board of Governors until 2018.

Ed Vogel has dedicated his life to the solid waste industry, building on the legacy of his family's business and guiding it through decades of growth, innovation and resilience. Beginning his career in high school operating equipment, Vogel went on to lead operations, oversee acquisitions and open the company's first material recovery facility. He played a pivotal role in navigating regulations, securing landfill permits and transforming setbacks into long-term opportunities. As vice president of Vogel Holding, he has spearheaded major capital investments including advanced wastewater treatment systems, single-stream recycling upgrades and the company's fleet transition to renewable natural gas. His 30-year pursuit to reopen and properly line the Tri-County Landfill exemplifies his deep commitment to environmental stewardship. Vogel has established a model of independent success and a legacy that will endure well beyond his tenure.



James M. Johnston, Autocar Truck



James M. Johnston has been a transformative force in the waste and recycling industry, leaving a legacy defined by innovation, safety and mentorship. He played a pivotal role in developing groundbreaking technologies going back to his start in the industry with McNeilus and currently with products like the E3 Diesel/Hydraulic Hybrid and Autocar's Advanced Driver Assistance Systems, significantly enhancing both efficiency and operator safety. His innovations-including one-touch dashboard diagnostics, rear corner glass windows and lightweight front-loader bodies-have redefined refuse truck functionality and maintenance. Through his visionary "Power of One" initiative, Johnston bridged the gap between chassis and body manufacturers, improving engineering collaboration and reducing production cycle times across the industry. A dedicated mentor and advocate for safety, he has influenced industry standards through his work with NWRA and ANSI, creating protocols that protect frontline workers. Johnston's legacy is not only in the trucks he's helped build but in the people and practices he's helped shape for the future of the industry.

Joseph Ursuy, Comerica Bank



Joseph Ursuy has more than 26 years of dedicated service to the waste and recycling industry. He has helped fuel its growth by providing approximately \$12 billion in credit facilities to over 270 businesses including more than 20 current NWRA Hall of Fame member companies. His deep relationships and financial expertise have enabled companies to expand fleets, build new facilities, adopt advanced technologies and drive innovation. Ursuy's enduring legacy extends beyond capital—he built a nationally recognized Environmental Services Department at Comerica, now supporting more than \$3 billion in credit and 100 clients with a dedicated team of 45 professionals. He also launched Comerica's Annual Client Appreciation Reception during WasteExpo, now in its 23rd year, bringing together more than 400 waste and environmental services industry leaders to foster meaningful, lasting connections. Ursuy's impact has shaped not only individual businesses but also the broader industry's future.

About the awards



Driver and Operator of the Year finalists were determined by a computerized scoring system. Independent judges selected the winners based on letters of recommendation and, for drivers, the difficulty of the route based upon factors such as pickups, weekly miles and manual versus automatic transmission. During judging, operators also were evaluated on the difficulty of the equipment operated. In addition to our winners who received the highest scores from our independent judges, the drivers and operators receiving honorable mentions were the next highest scoring applicants.

Hall of Fame inductees are selected based on scores in five categories, including recognition in the industry as a founder, pioneer, visionary or icon; enduring legacy and impact of contributions to the industry for a minimum of 25 years; steadfast values such as integrity, respect, courage, mentorship, volunteerism and inclusiveness; inspirational leadership at an NWRA service provider or supplier and on issues important to NWRA at the national, state and/or local level; and active association engagement and service as an ambassador of the waste industry.
